Fiscal Crisis cuts Parks funding to 0.5% of the City's budget





CURRENT STATE OF PARKS

85% of Parks Stewards recorded an increase in usership in the last 3 years

70% of Parks Stewards recorded an increase in usership outside of the traditional busy season (May – August)

53% of Parks Stewards said visitors express safety concerns about their park

29% increase in crimes against persons in the first 4 months of FY 23*

27% increase in crimes against property in first 4 months of FY 23*
