Project Brief: New York City has not produced enough housing to keep up with the rapid population and job growth that our city has experienced in recent decades. As a result, more than half of New York City's renters spend over a third of their income on rent, homeownership is increasingly out of reach, working New Yorkers face long commutes, and displacement pressure is stronger.

The City of Yes for Housing Opportunity initiative is designed to address New York's housing crisis by building a little more housing in every neighborhood.

Work with DSNY: Emergency Snow Shovelers

DSNY recruits temporary, per diem Emergency Snow Shovelers. These Shovelers are called on after heavy snowfalls to remove snow and ice Citywide from areas like bus stops, crosswalks and fire hydrants. Pay starts at \$18.00 per hour and increases to \$27 per hour after the first 40 hours worked in a week. To be eligible, applicants must be:

- At least 18 years old
- Eligible to work in the United States
- Able to perform heavy physical labor

Christmas Tree Recycling

All residents of Brooklyn can simply place their tree out, with their food scraps and yard waste, for collection on their regularly scheduled compost and recycling day. **Remove all stands, tinsel, lights and ornaments** before putting trees out for collection. Do NOT wrap trees in plastic bags. This is the first time trees can be set out as curbside compost collection! After collection, the Christmas trees will be chipped, mixed with leaves, and recycled into compost for the city's parks, institutions and community gardens.

Need to get rid of an artificial tree?

Residents looking to get rid of an artificial tree should separate and remove the metal base and trunk and place those parts with their other metal recycling.
